This qualifying law degree will let you progress to the vocational stage of training as a solicitor or barrister.

You'll study both academic and practical aspects of the law, which, as well as preparing you for a legal career, will give you many skills that are highly valued in other occupations. We encourage you to focus on your areas of interest and develop specialisms, such as Business and the Law, Law of Information, Intellectual Property and Social Media, or Sports Law .

By choosing, and successfully completing, particular modules you could graduate with two awards: the LLB (Hons) and Higher Diploma in Paralegal Practice from the National Association of Licensed Paralegals. The Higher Diploma can help you to secure a job as a paralegal. It can also give you a head start with the Legal Practice Course (LPC) or Bar Professional Training Course (BPTC), by introducing you to some of the skills you'll develop on these courses.

CILEx Level 6 Single Subject Certificates

CILEx's Level 6 Single Subject Certificates offer professional recognition to legal executives, lawyers, solicitors and anyone in a professional role that requires specific knowledge of law. You can select from Land Law, Law of Tort, Civil Litigation, Conveyancing, Client Care Skills and Legal Research Skills and choose to work towards a Level 6 Professional Higher Diploma in Law and Practice as a result. This course is part-time, evenings.

CILEx Graduate Fast-track Diploma

Entry requirements

Qualifying LLB Law Degree or GDL (achieved in the last 7 years)

This CILEx Graduate Fast-track Diploma offers graduates the opportunity to qualify as a Chartered Legal Executive Lawyer and a CILEx Fellow by completing two practice and one professional skills unit. This course is part-time, evenings.

LLM Medical Law and Ethics

Part-time only

Entry requirements

Normally a degree in a relevant subject with a minimum of lower second class honours. Applicants with other qualifications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

This course will give you the chance to study the ethical and legal issues that arise in medical and healthcare practice. You'll explore the moral problems faced by workers in these fields, learn about the issues that may raise legal liability in these contexts, and reflect upon the legal, social and ethical context in which healthcare law is situated. The teaching on the course takes places in concentrated blocks of several days, making this the ideal course to combine with employment'

LLM International Business Law

Entry requirements

Usually a 2:2 honours degree classification (or equivalent) in Law or a degree with an element of Law

Location:	Cambridge

This course will give you an understanding of law in an international context. Through a combination of theory and practical application, you will explore issues of law and legal theory at an advanced level.

You'll investigate areas like trade law and dispute resolution, but will also have the chance to specialise in your own particular areas of interest, such as international governance or competition law.

Throughout the course you'll develop research skills vital both to your assignments on the course, and your future career. Supported by a teaching team that consists of professionally qualified legal practitioners as well as research-active academics, you can be confident you'll receive up-to-date advice on your future career as well as the latest legal theory and case studies.

LLM Digital Economy

Entry requirements

Usually a first degree, with honours, in a related subject and at a minimum final classification of lower second (2:2) or equivalent.

On this course you will study the legal, economic and business background to the regulation of infrastructure, content and trading relations across the digital economy globally.

You'll gain the analytical tools necessary for assessing different governance and legal claims, and develop rational and consistent argument in discourse about dilemmas in regulation of digital content, information and infrastructure.

The course provides a strong emphasis on the evaluation and development of communications (infrastructure), content (intellectual property) and information law (including social networks) practice to promote knowledge of transactional and regulatory work in the digital economy.

You will study alongside students from across the globe and interact with tutors and guest speakers working at the highest level of digital economy / industry.

LLM International Commercial Law

Entry requirements

Usually a 2:2 honours degree classification (or equivalent) in Law or a degree with an element of Law

This course will provide you with a combination of theory and practical application that is relevant to the demands of international commercial practice, and in particular the relationship between legal disciplines and commercial undertakings.

It will give you the necessary background and legal expertise for international commercial law and academic research at the highest level as well as for a wide range of other intellectually demanding roles.

You'll investigate areas like commercial contracts, transnational commercial law and dispute resolution, but will also have the chance to specialise in your own particular areas of interest, such as international governance or company law.

Throughout the course you'll develop research skills vital both to your assignments on the course, and your future career.

Legal Practice Course (PG Dip)

Entry requirements

One of the following:
A UK Qualifying Law Degree with a minimum classification of 2.2 Honours;
a pass in the Common Professional Examination (CPE);
OR a recognised Graduate Diploma in Law (GDL).

If you want to become a solicitor in England or Wales, this course will allow you to proceed on to the training contract that must be completed to qualify for professional practice.

On our LPC, you'll benefit from extra support and training, like non-assessed training in areas like billing, file management and commercial awareness and negotiation skills and a specialist non-assessed course in careers and professional development.

With our links to regional practitioners, who also help to develop the course, you'll have access to the latest careers advice, and maybe even the opportunity to interview for a training contract. We'll also keep you up to date on the legal job market by mailing a vacancies bulletin directly to your inbox every month.

LLM Legal Practice (Top-up)

Entry requirements

Entry is admission with 120 credits at Level 7

If you've completed the Legal Practice Course or Bar Professional Training Course, or you're a practising solicitor or barrister who has taken the former Law Society Final Examinations or BVC, this course will top up your qualification to an LLM Legal Practice. If you're an overseas lawyer then, subject to taking the Qualified Lawyers' Transfer Scheme (QLTS/QLTT) and/or gaining university accreditation of prior learning and experience, you could also be eligible to apply.

The course will let you explore your own chosen area of legal professional practice in depth. This could be part of your current professional practice, an area that you wish to work in, or one that's just of academic interest to you.*

Over a 4-day seminar series, you'll develop your research skills, learning to interrogate hard-copy and electronic sources, to create and conduct surveys, questionnaires and interviews, and to write-up and present your research findings. These skills will not only be invaluable for your studies, but are also in great demand by employers in the legal profession.

You'll then apply these skills to your chosen topic by researching and writing a 15,000-word dissertation. Your independent work will be supported by a dedicated supervisor, who will help you develop your research proposal / hypothesis, discuss your methodology (including ethics clearance) and act as a mentor throughout.

Getting funding

For Undergraduate study

If you don't already have a first degree you're entitled to a full student loan for your fees and you'll receive a maintenance grant of up to £5,555 every year. You won't have to pay this back until you graduate and earn over £21,000. Even then, it will only be a small percentage of your future monthly salary.

Our Books Plus scheme helps most first-year students from the UK or EU with study-related costs. You may be eligible for Books Plus credit worth £400 to go towards laptops, books and much more.

For Postgraduate study

You can help fund your postgraduate study through several means including studentships, bursaries, grants and Career Development Loans. You might also get help from your employer if you wish to study part-time - it's worth asking. If you're a current or past student of Anglia Ruskin University you can also get £1000 off your fees. You just need to fill out the application form at www.anglia.ac.uk/scholarships

"If you're under 30, you can also apply to a Postgraduate Student Loan Scheme, which offers up to £10,000 to cover fees and living costs. This loan will be added onto your current student loan and paid back in the same way via monthly deductions from your future salary.
